#### PROJECT SUBMISSIONS

Our first of two recent bid submissions was with <u>Houston Kiltmakers</u>, a fourth-generation, family-run business with over 100 years of expertise in Highland wear and tartan craftsmanship. Their store is located on the High Street down from UWS Paisley campus; it's great to partner with such a local business!

In collaboration with the School of Business & Creative Industries, this KTP project will support the digital transformation of the business, enhancing management capability and accelerating UK and international growth whilst maintaining the tradition and artisanal nature of the business

Our second recent submission was with <u>Aldomak</u>, a family-run handmade confectionery business based in Giffnock, Glasgow. Established in 1932, Aldomak specialises in crafting premium Scottish treats and distributing ice cream accompaniments across Scotland and beyond.

In partnership with the School of Computing, Engineering & Physical Sciences, this KTP project's goal is to streamline and automate existing manufacturing, business processes and management systems, maximising productivity and providing a platform for accelerated growth.

We look forward to getting these new partnerships underway in 2025!
